People who got the PFIZER vaccine (6 months ago or more):

- ages 65 and up
- ♦ ages 18 64 <u>AND</u>:
 - \bullet have an underlying medical condition

OR

• live in long-term care (group living)

<u>OR</u>

• at increased risk due to working/living settings (EX: hospitals/health care, schools, jails, shelters, etc.)







Starting October 1st, 2021

SNAP households will receive an increased monthly SNAP benefit, beginning in October 2021.



Why the change?

SNAP benefits were boosted 15% during the pandemic.

This boost ends on September 30th.



USDA recently increased SNAP benefit levels by 21%.

This increase starts on October 1st.
