IL Education Day at the State House

Monday, March 25th was *Independent Living* [IL] *Education Day at the State House*. CLW is one of 10 *Independent Living Centers* [ILC's] in Massachusetts [https://www.mass.gov/independent-living-centers] and the *only* ILC with a *Deaf and Hard of Hearing Independent Living Services* [DHILS] department. We joined staff and consumers from the other 9 ILC's to advocate for our consumers' needs, including suggested PCA [*Personal Care Attendant*] budget cuts and program changes. If passed, <u>6,000</u> MA residents may lose their PCA services. <u>NOTE</u>: See Advocacy Action Forum flyer about a rally on May 2nd to learn more and show your support.

The morning program was held in the *Hall of Flags*. Many legislator's stopped by to show their support for ILC's and the services we provide, as well as bills they're backing. Several community members shared their personal stories and discussed the impact of the state budget.

After a wonderful lunch CLW staff visited some legislators in their offices to ask for continued support. It was an interesting and informative day!


Stop Medicare Fraud!

Here are **3 tips** to protect yourself from *Medicare* fraud and scams:

- 1) If you get a call, text or email asking for your Medicare Number, don't respond. Don't give your Medicare card or Medicare Number to anyone except your doctor or people you know should have it.
- 2) Check your Medicare Summary Notices (MSNs) or claims statements carefully. If you see a charge for a service you didn't get or a product you didn't order, it may be fraud. If you suspect fraud, report it at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).
- 3) Guard your Medicare card like it's a credit card.
