# Beware: *Scammers Posing as IRS*

Identity thieves may try to contact taxpayers through fake calls, emails, texts and social media [Facebook, Instagram, X] messages. They <u>pretend</u> to be the IRS to steal your money or personal information.



#### How do you know when it's <u>really</u> the IRS contacting you? Email, text and social media

#### The IRS will:

• Mail a letter or notice **before** calling or emailing.

#### The IRS will not:

- Send unexpected or unsolicited text messages.
- Start contact by email, text message or through social media.
- Send messages asking for personal or financial information, *especially about tax refunds*.

#### **Typical IRS-related online scams**

- "Phishing" emails pretending to be from IRS staff.
- Fake IRS social media accounts that contact taxpayers about a fake bill, grant or refund.



• Text messages sent for fake "tax credits" or "stimulus payments."

#### Phone calls

#### The IRS will:

- mail a notice or letter first, <u>then</u> call to confirm an appointment or discuss a scheduled audit.
- have a private collection agency call if the taxpayer owes a debt, but <u>only after</u> sending a written letter/notice.

#### The IRS will not:

- leave pre-recorded, urgent or threatening messages. <u>NOTE</u>: any message that says you'll be arrested if you don't call back is a SCAM.
- will <u>never</u> ask you to pay using any kind of pre-paid card, store or online gift card.

#### **IRS Letters and Notices**

A letter or notice is <u>usually</u> the **first** contact a taxpayer gets from the IRS.

If you're suspicious or not sure, you can check to see if it's *really* the IRS by:

- logging on to your secure <u>IRS Online Account</u> to see a copy of the notice or letter.
- contacting <u>IRS customer service</u> to confirm it's real or a scam.
- reviewing IRS letters and notices at <u>Understanding Your IRS Notice or Letter</u>.
- checking that a *private collection agency* has the **same** *Taxpayer Authentication Number* as the IRS notice.

#### Warning Signs of a Scam

Received an unexpected letter, email or text that claims to be from the IRS, bank, credit company or other trusted sources? **Here are some signs that it's a scam:** 

- Spelling **errors** or **incorrect grammar**.
- A link or attachment with a *slightly* misspelled URL [website address] or a strange site. [EX: website says "irs.**com**" but the real IRS website is "irs.**gov**"]
- A threatening or urgent request to **pay now**, **follow a link** or **open an attachment**.







# Summer Tips for Protecting Hearing Devices from Sweat and Humidity by Michelle DeStefano

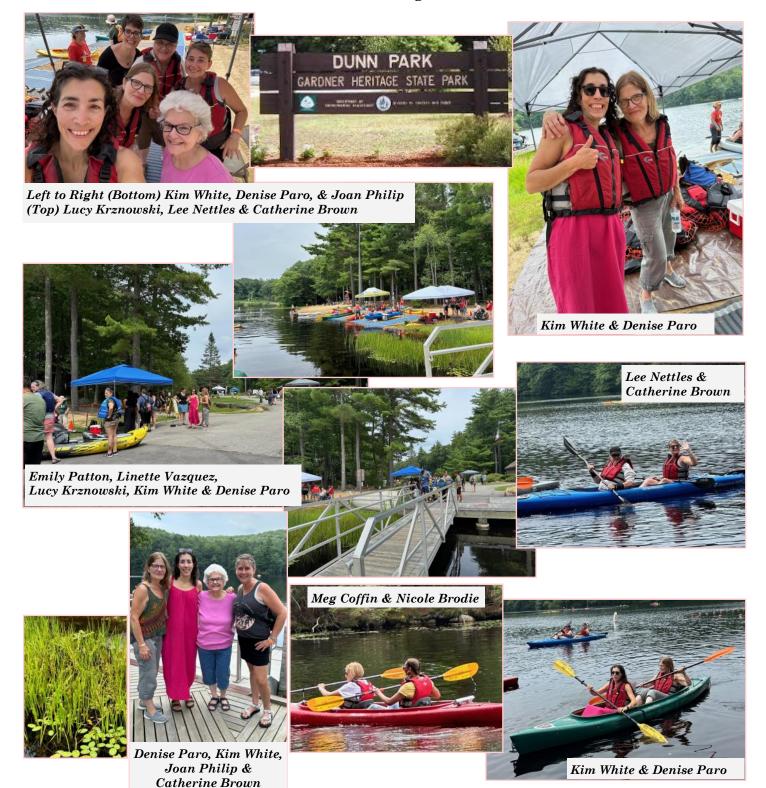


- Moisture Protection Products: use products designed to protect hearing aids/ cochlear implants [CIs] from moisture. <u>EX</u>: sweat-resistant covers or sleeves by Ear Gear and hearing aid headbands by Ear Band-It.
- 2) Waterproof Cases: check with your audiologist, hearing aid/CI manufacturer for suggestions.
- 3) **Retention Clips**: secure devices to stop them from moving or falling out [due to sweat and movement].
- 4) **Dehumidifiers**: store your devices in a dehumidifier or drying box overnight to remove moisture. *EX*: *DriAid* or *Redux*
- 5) Avoid Direct Water Exposure: don't get your devices wet! [unless they are <u>specifically</u> designed to be waterproof—see #2].

# **Upcoming Account Changes:** Switch to Login.gov or ID.me for Sign In

### Did you setup an online Social Security account before September 18, 2021?

If you did, you must change to a **Login.gov** account to continue accessing your online services.

### How do you do this?

Social Security

Go to https://www.ssa.gov/myaccount/ and log in. Look for the option to change to Login.gov. When your account is successfully linked, a confirmation screen will pop-up, and you will have immediate access to your personal my Social Security services.
